Dear Parents:

There is a case of ringworm in your child's grade. Please monitor your child for an itchy, red, dry, scaly, ring shaped rash. Ringworm most commonly occurs on the scalp, but is also found on the feet or body. Ringworm on the skin appears flat with inflamed ring-like sores that may itch or burn. Ringworm on the feet appears scaly, red and swollen, with cracking and peeling of the skin, especially between the toes, or with blisters containing thin watery fluid.

If your child has ringworm, consult your healthcare provider for treatment. Keep your child home until your healthcare provider permits return.
